Only an hour's drive from the North Sea ferry terminal, and close to major roads, the site is easy to find and you are assured of a warm and friendly welcome.

Set in the heart of Hadrian's Wall Country only a mile from the Wall itself, all the major Roman forts, such as Vindolanda, Housesteads and Chesters, are within easy reach. As well as the panoramic National Park, Hadrian's Wall World Heritage Site, Hadrian's Wall Path, Northumberland is steeped in history and rich in heritage.

Known as England's Border County, Northumberland has more castles, including Alnwick Castle and Garden, than any other county and many fine houses and estates; close links with early Christianity are present in the ancient abbeys and other important sites such as Holy Island (Lindisfarne).

Newcastle and the whole of Tyneside is just 30 minutes away. You'll find all the shopping and nightlife you could wish for, including the famous Metro Centre, one of Europe's largest indoor shopping and leisure complexes.

If outdoor activities are your main interest, these abound on the doorstep. Golf, horse-riding or fishing, the area offers some of the finest facilities to be found anywhere in Europe. The extensive lake of Kielder Water close by is a flourishing centre for a variety of water sports.

We are also perfectly sited for visits to the Scottish Borders, England's Lake District and both east and west coasts, each with its own unique attraction.

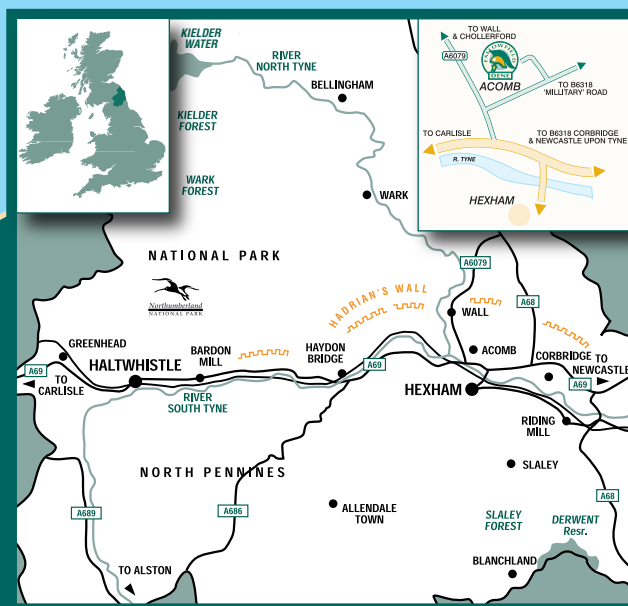

How to find Fallowfield Dene

Getting to Fallowfield Dene couldn't be easier. We are located close to the A69, the main east/west route from Tyneside (A1) to Carlisle and the Lake District (M6).

From the A69 follow the sign for Acomb, Bellingham and Rothbury (A6079). After a short distance you will enter the village of Acomb. Look out for a sign indicating a right turn to Fallowfield. Outside Acomb village there is a signpost to Fallowfield Dene Caravan Park. Follow this road up to the site entrance.

The site is very secluded at the end of a no through road and not close to any built up areas. For your security, access is controlled by a barrier opened by a 'swipe card' which is issued to visitors on arrival.

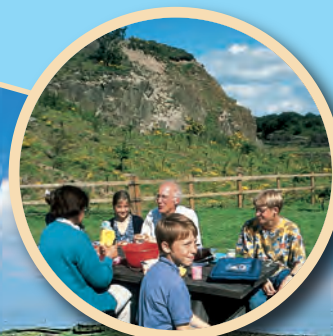

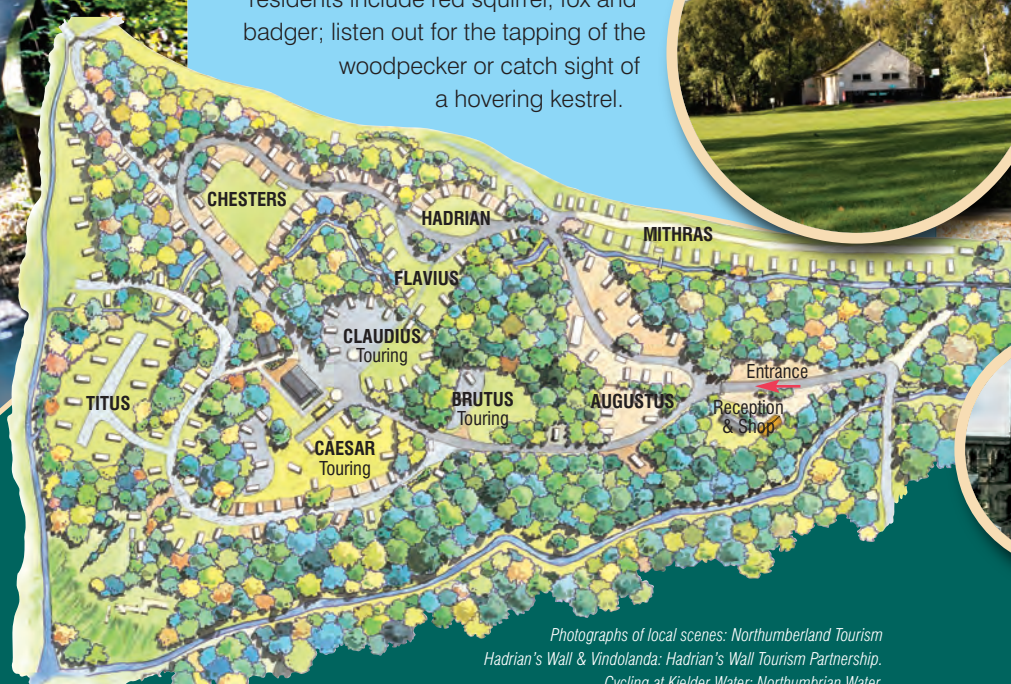
There's a site shop with a good range of basic food and other necessities, including replacement gas cylinders. For a wider choice of groceries and other items Hexham and Corbridge, with several supermarkets and a number of excellent specialist shops, are just two miles away.

Toilet and shower blocks are of high specification, and regularly checked and maintained for your comfort. A fully equipped launderette on site helps keep those travel clothes clean.



You'll enjoy exploring Fallowfield Dene with its network of tracks and there's even a 'Doggy Walk' for visitors to exercise their pets.

Home to an abundance of wildlife, local residents include red squirrel, fox and badger; listen out for the tapping of the woodpecker or catch sight of a hovering kestrel.



For those of an adventurous nature, and an urge to get familiar with the local terrain, we are always happy to suggest routes for experienced or novice cyclists alike.

If you like to take an occasional break from self-catering, there are several first class restaurants in Hexham and the surrounding area. Most local pubs offer tasty and appetising meals at very reasonable prices.
